Dorothy attended Stewart Elementary School and Lincoln Senior High School, Class of 1968 in Forrest City, Arkansas. She earned a diploma from Draughon School of Business in Little Rock, Arkansas and attended Henderson State University in Arkadelphia, Arkansas. Dorothy worked at GI Manufacturing Company in Forrest City, Arkansas, University Hospital, and Westinghouse Lighting in Little Rock, Arkansas.
