September 17, 1944 - February 25, 2026

Miss Inez Williams, daughter of the late Mrs. Leona Poole-Bond, who preceded her in death, was born on Sunday, September 17, 1944. Miss Inez Williams peacefully transitioned from labor to eternal reward on February 25, 2026, at Baptist Memorial Hospital in Memphis, Tennessee.

Miss Inez Williams lived a life that was a testament to faith, compassion, and quiet strength. Her presence was a steady light, and her kindness left an imprint on everyone blessed to know her. Her life’s journey reflected humility, perseverance, and a deep commitment to family and community. Whether offering a listening ear, sharing wisdom, or extending a helping hand, she embodied the virtues she held dear. To many, she was a nurturer, a counselor, and a source of encouragement.

Upon returning to Arkansas, Miss Inez Williams continued her mission of service at the St. Francis County Health Unit, the Forrest City Senior Citizens Center, and as a Certified Nursing Assistant. Her spiritual walk continued at Saints' Temple Church of God in Christ, where she faithfully worshipped. She did not just attend church; her kindness was her ministry, her giving was her testimony, and her conversations were her fellowship.

Miss Inez Williams found joy in the simple blessings God provided. She delighted in thrift shopping and rummage sales, planting flowers and tending her garden, watching things grow as a reminder of the beauty of God's creation. She loved people and never met a stranger. Her heart was a well that never ran dry, always giving, always loving, always sharing. If you encountered her, you encountered warmth. If you spoke with her, you felt joy.

She was preceded in death by her father, Oliver Williams; five sisters, Georgia Lee Hardy, Francis Mae Humphrey, Ora Lee Barton, Dorothy Mae Poole, and Carrie Lee Smith; and two brothers, Larry Bond and Rayfield Bond, who now

stand with her in that great cloud of witnesses.

She leaves to cherish her precious memories her beloved partner, Curtis McDaniel of Palestine, Arkansas, whose steadfast companionship brought her comfort and joy for more than twenty years.
