Leon Edward Clark was born August 18, 1948 to Charlie Johnson and Florida Clark in Chicago, Illinois. He was the third child of four siblings.

He accepted Christ at an early age. He and his younger brother, Neartis, relocated to Forrest City, Arkansas after their mother's death to be raised by their uncle and aunt. He graduated from Lincoln High School with honors in 1966. After high school he entered the Air Force and served two and one half years working in communications. He was honorably discharged in 1970.

Leon continued his education and enrolled in Stillman College in Tuscaloosa, Alabama on a four-year athletic scholarship, majoring in Business Administration.

Leon trained and served on many boards: the Regional Leaders Program, Training and Technical Workshop, the Grantsmanship Training Program, and the BAGCDC Program for Boys and Girls in Marvell, Arkansas. He was also an Associate Minister at Apostolic Life Center in Marvell, Arkansas for five years and at Greater First Baptist Church for six years.

He was married to Thelma Jones, and this union was blessed with two children. He later married Christine Davis, and their union was blessed with one child.

Leon was preceded in death by his parents—Charlie Johnson and Florida Clark; and a brother—Clayton Johnson.

He leaves to cherish his memories two sisters—Delores McCleod and Victoria Black both of Atlanta, Georgia; a brother—Neartis Clark (Patricia) of Forrest City, Arkansas; three children—LaKeisha Garrett of Illinois, Ponce de Leon Clark of Illinois, and Christopher Clark of Arkansas; a stepdaughter—Tamara Anglin of Colorado; five grandchildren; and a host of other relatives and friends.
